## BIDDING FOR SUPPORT AMONG TOWN CENTRE BUSINESSES

Businesses are being presented with the opportunity to steer Bedford Town Centre into a successful new future - through a BID (Business Improvement District).

A series of 21 street meetings for businesses in the BID area were staged during July and saw even the most sceptical attendee persuaded about the boost to business which could come through the ideas on offer.

The scheme is being steered by the well-established Bedford Town Centre Company which has already come up with many ideas which have brought business into Bedford. Because of these initiatives, Bedford Town Centre was chosen as 1 of only 22 towns in the UK to pilot the BID, which is based on a hugely successful American idea. In addition the BID for Bedford has been given £30,000 by the East of England Development Agency to help get the message across.

Over 200 organisations have now taken part in face to face or street meetings to look at setting up a BID in Bedford (BedfordBID). Businesses were asked to indicate a total of about 5 priority projects. Mo Aswat of Bedford Town Centre Company said. "This will be about delivering a small number of high quality, quick & visible improvements and not a wish list that takes 5 or 10 years to bring about".

Those businesses attending the street meetings were asked at the end to give an indication of how they would vote on the basis of what they had heard. A huge majority, 90%, said they would vote Yes in the poll in favour of a BedfordBID. The actual vote will take place in early 2005 and if the vote is yes then everybody in the BedfordBID area will have to take part. The other benefit of a Yes vote would be that at least £100,000 will be available from other sources like property owners.


